Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of assessing children's progress. She knows how to plan a broad curriculum for children of all ages to help support their learning needs. In addition, the childminder recognises the value of working closely with parents and other professionals to help promote continuity of care and learning.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of how to safeguard children. She knows the possible signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect and how to refer any concerns to the relevant authorities. Daily checks and risk assessments of her home help the childminder to identify and remove any potential hazards to children.
- The childminder explains how she builds secure bonds with children to help promote their emotional well-being and independence.
- The childminder has clear expectations, which she explains to the children. She knows how to promote positive behaviour effectively.
- The childminder recognises the need to evaluate her provision to help continually improve outcomes for children. For example, she knows how to continue with her own professional development to help improve her knowledge and understanding and keep up to date with any changes and requirements.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
