Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider understands the early years foundation stage requirements. There are systems to monitor children's development and the educational programmes offered.
- The provider has a good understanding of how children learn and develop. They recognise the importance of observing children and planning activities based on their interests. The nursery has a range of resources and provide activities to promote children's engagement in learning.
- The provider understands the benefit of developing partnerships with parents and other professionals. She knows how to share information about children's needs to ensure consistency and help them to progress.
- The provider recognises the importance of training and self evaluation in improving provision for all children. For example, staff receive regular supervision meetings and then complete training to support their practice.
- The provider knows how to promote children's health and well-being. For example, children engage in daily outdoor play in the nursery garden and visit the community garden where they learn how to grow fruit and vegetables.
- The provider has an understanding of how to promote children's behaviour. Staff are good role models and use different strategies to encourage children to share and take turns with resources.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
