Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders and staff are fully aware of their responsibility to safeguard children. They know the signs that indicate children may be at risk of harm. Leaders and staff explain the local procedures to follow and how to seek advice, or report a concern, about a child's welfare. They know what to do if an allegation is made about a member of staff.
- Leaders demonstrate a secure understanding of the policies in place to keep children safe. For example, they explain the medication procedures that staff follow for children with special medical needs.
- Leaders explain how staff would ensure that the premises are ready for young children each day. For example, they describe how staff would check all fire exits and ensure walkways are clear. Staff will also ensure that toys and equipment are suitable for children attending for the camp.
- Leaders have a suitable understanding of how to plan children's play. They say that staff will consider children's views. For instance, as part of planning, staff would find out what children are interested in at home and observe activities to see what they enjoy. Staff will then use this information as basis for future planning.
- Leaders explain how staff support children to develop healthy lifestyles. Staff help children to be active by ensuring that they participate in a wide range of physical activities. They describe how children play sports, such as football, basketball, or tennis.
- Staff make sure children understand the importance of hygiene routines, such as regularly washing their hands. Leaders and staff work with parents to ensure children bring healthy foods in their packed lunches.
- Leaders and staff demonstrate a good understanding of the importance of consistent approaches to supporting children's behaviour. They talk about maintaining positive communication with parents to ensure that they can mirror successful strategies.
- Leaders explain how they closely monitor the quality of care and play opportunities that staff provide for children. Staff are keen to keep up to date with new information and continue to build on their skills and knowledge. This helps to ensure that children receive good quality care and have plenty of stimulating activities available during their time at the camp.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
