Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Staff describe how they take into account children's views and interests when deciding what activities they will provide. They understand that this supports children's concentration and leads to good behaviour in the club.
- Staff demonstrate an understanding of the importance of developing positive and respectful relationships with children. They understand the importance of supporting and encouraging children's confidence and independence. Staff outline their high expectations for children's behaviour. They explain the rules of the setting. For example, that children must stay off the grass when it is wet.
- Children have access to outdoor play. Staff describe the opportunities for children to run, climb and join in team games. Staff understand the importance of developing children's sense of pride in their achievements. They explain how they make sure all children can join in and celebrate their successes, for example, when scoring a goal.
- Staff describe how they teach children to keep themselves safe and healthy. They encourage children to wash their hands after wiping their nose or using the toilet and before eating. Fresh drinking water and healthy snacks are provided. For example, make-your-own wraps with a range of nutritious fillings. Staff explain how they use crafts, such as painting 'healthy plates', to help children understand healthy food choices.
- Staff outline their procedures for communicating with parents and school. They use daily face-to-face discussions to share information to help them meet children's needs. They know how to adapt their provision for children who may need additional support.
- Through discussion, staff demonstrate a good understanding of keeping children safe. They understand the signs that a child may be at risk of harm and what action they should take.
- Leaders support staff's professional development. They describe how they give them regular feedback on their practice. They ensure staff's essential training is kept up to date, such as paediatric first aid.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Of these, one holds an appropriate early years qualification at level 3. They open from Monday to Friday, during term time, excluding bank holidays. Sessions are from 7.30am until 9am and 3.10pm until 6pm.
