Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates that he understands how to assess children's starting points in learning. He explains how he will use the information gathered to plan activities that help children to make good progress in their learning and development. The childminder describes how he will summarise children's development stages between the ages of two and three.
- The childminder understands how to support children that might require extra help. He explains how he will work with parents and other professionals to provide an inclusive service that is tailored to meet individual children's needs.
- The childminder describes a broad range of experiences that he will provide for children to help them develop knowledge, skills and attitudes that will prepare them for their next stage of learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of helping children to understand what is expected of them. He talks about the significance of explaining rules to children and ensuring that there is consistency in managing children's behaviour. He describes how he will use praise and encouragement to support children to behave well.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents. He describes how he will talk with parents about children's learning, interests and care needs. He explains how he will give parents ideas of how to continue children's learning at home.
- The childminder describes how he will strive for continuous improvement. He describes how he undertakes training to help him improve his knowledge on areas of his practice he can improve upon. The childminder gains independent feedback to help him understand his strengths and areas for development.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
