Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains how she will evaluate her service. For example, she undertakes regular training opportunities to raise her knowledge and skills. She understands the importance of continuous professional development.
- The childminder describes her curriculum intent and the skills she wants children to learn, ready for the next stages in their learning. For example, she says that she will promote children's early reading skills and a love of books.
- The childminder confirms that she will encourage children to share toys, and show respect and tolerance for each other. She says she will act as a positive role model, and intends to promote a respectful and positive culture for all children.
- The childminder knows the importance of engaging with parents and other professionals. She explains how she will share important information with them to swiftly identify any gaps in children's learning for a targeted approach.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting children's good health and exercise, including to support their social skills. She describes how she will plan daily outings, such as to local parks, children's centres and sing-along sessions at the library.
- The childminder explains how she will minimise and remove all hazards to children. She understands the importance of daily safety checks so that her home is safe for children to play and learn in.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
