Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of how to implement the learning and development requirements. She describes a range of experiences that will support children in all areas of learning.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's good behaviour. She discusses a range of strategies she can use to help children know what is expected from them.
- The childminder explains the procedures she will use to assess what children are able to do when they first start to attend. She describes how she will build upon children's existing knowledge and skills to help them make good progress in their learning and development.
- The childminder describes how she will work in partnership with parents and other professionals. She understands the importance of creating a consistent approach for children.
- The childminder demonstrates a commitment to engaging in training and professional development. She attends regular webinars and seeks support from her local authority. This helps to keep her knowledge current.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the need to provide an inclusive service. She recognises each child is unique and explains how she would support children to feel included.
- The childminder understands the signs and symptoms that might indicate that abuse is happening. She knows what to do if concerns arise about children. The childminder understands the procedure to follow if there was an allegation against her or somebody in her household.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
