Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is dedicated to providing children with opportunities to develop and enhance their skills. She has a good knowledge of the areas of learning and explains what she intends to teach children.
- The childminder explains how she will use information received from parents and carers. She will also use her own observations to explore where children are within their development journeys, when they first join the setting. The childminder describes how she will then use this information to support all children to achieve and make progress.
- The childminder explains how she intends to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND). She discusses how she will support children with referrals to outside agencies if needed. The childminder describes how she will look at supportive strategies to help children to develop.
- The childminder explains how she will plan daily opportunities for children to move their bodies in different ways. She describes how this will support children to develop physically.
- The childminder talks about healthy practices. She explains how she will plan to teach children about hygiene. The childminder shares activity ideas that she intends to complete to support children to learn about brushing their teeth.
- The childminder explains how she intends to support children to understand and manage their own safety. For example, she explains how she will teach children about road safety.
- The childminder shares how she will focus on storytelling sessions. She discusses how this will support children within their communication development and be a calming time for children. The childminder wants children to have opportunities to reflect on their own experiences to support their understanding.
- The childminder shares how she plans to build strong methods of communication with parents. She wants parents to feel comfortable to share information with her.
- The childminder is passionate about children having cooking experiences. She describes the many learning opportunities that she intends to explore with children. The childminder also expresses how creating and cooking different recipes will support children to try new foods.
- The childminder is reflective. She strives to provide an inclusive environment for all children and families. The childminder plans to use feedback from parents, as well as children's preferences, to support her to continue to develop and enhance her practice. She explains about how she will explore training opportunities to support her.
- The childminder understands the signs and symptoms that would indicate that a child is at risk of abuse. She understands the actions that she would take if she has concerns about a child.
- The childminder explains how she will support children's behaviour, including listening, sharing and using 'kind hands'. She discusses how she will speak to children about the rules in her setting and why these are in place.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
