Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder keeps her safeguarding knowledge current. She understands what action to take if she has concerns about children's welfare, in line with the local safeguarding partnership. The childminder carries out daily risk assessments to ensure that her premises are safe while caring for children.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents, and other professionals involved in children's care. She explains how effective information sharing helps to provide consistency in children's care, learning and development.
- The childminder knows how to keep children healthy. For example, she understands how to teach children about the importance of good hygiene routines, including before eating and after play outside. The childminder explains how she ensures children regularly access outdoors and keep active through daily routines.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's positive behaviour, including through praise and encouragement. She explains how she teaches children to be kind and respectful of the differing needs of their friends, as they play together.
- The childminder demonstrates, through discussions, how she will implement her curriculum intent, and the skills and knowledge she wants children to learn. She understands how to check children's progress and to put in place support where children need additional help.
- The childminder understands the importance of self-evaluation and her professional development to help improve her knowledge and skills.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
