## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good knowledge of the learning and development requirements. Through discussion, the childminder demonstrates how she would focus on the prime areas of learning for young children. She talks about the importance of supporting children's physical development and communication and language skills. She is aware of assessing children's development when they are between two and three years of age.
- Through discussion, the childminder describes how she would promote children's social development and support them to develop respectful relationships with others. For example, she understands the importance of helping children to learn about turn taking, to understand about their feelings and how to navigate these.
- The childminder understands the importance of supporting children's health and well-being. She demonstrates, through discussion, how she promotes healthy eating and provides daily opportunities for children to enjoy fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder demonstrates a thorough understanding of her role and responsibilities in promoting children's safety and welfare, as well as supporting their learning. She understands the importance of keeping her skills and knowledge up to date and attends relevant training. She maintains a valid first-aid qualification.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of how to safeguard children. She knows the possible signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect and how to refer any concerns to the relevant authorities. She is also aware of the procedure to follow if an allegation was made against herself.
- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrates how she will evaluate her practice. She intends to do this by gathering feedback from parents and children to identify ways of improving children's overall experiences, while in her care.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
