Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not meet all of the statutory requirements of the early years foundation stage. She does not hold a current paediatric first-aid certificate.
- The childminder explains how she will support children's development across all seven learning areas. She describes how she will promote children's learning and help them to make progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of gathering detailed information from parents and carers to tailor support for each child's needs. She outlines how she will assess children's starting points in development to create a child-led curriculum.
- Through discussion, the childminder shows a suitable understanding of how to encourage children's positive behaviour. She outlines the ways she will build children's confidence and self-esteem.
- The childminder discusses how she will promote children's understanding of healthy lifestyles. For example, she discusses how she will plan opportunities for children to develop their understanding of healthy eating.
- The childminder has attended refresher training to stay informed about safeguarding children. She knows the relevant agencies to contact if she has concerns about a child's well-being or if an allegation is made against her.
- The childminder understands the importance of conducting risk assessments to identify and eliminate hazards, to ensure children's safety.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable knowledge of how to review the curriculum to ensure that children achieve positive outcomes from their starting points in development.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?
