Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders describe how they want children to enjoy attending the club and have lots of fun. They aim to provide a welcoming and inclusive space for all children. Leaders explain they will provide a broad programme of events that cater for children's individual interests, including adult-led activities such as cooking, dance, sports and art.
- Leaders are keen to further enhance children's enthusiasm for learning. They explain how they will arrange interesting experiences that children may not have had previously, such as animal handling sessions or exploring stories with a children's author.
- Leaders say that children's welfare is their top priority and outline how they will provide a safe environment indoors and outdoors. This includes training staff to implement the club's policies and procedures, such as ensuring that children only leave with parents or authorised carers.
- Leaders explain how staff will support children to understand the expectations for their behaviour. For example, they will provide daily 'debriefings', which remind children of the club's rules, to help keep everyone safe and well.
- Leaders detail their commitment to promoting healthy lifestyles for children. They discuss how they will organise the daily timetable to include opportunities for physical activity and outdoor play, as well as time for children to rest, eat and rehydrate.
- Leaders explain how they will evaluate the provision, taking account of feedback from children, parents and staff. They say this enables continual improvement. For example, staff have identified that children concentrate better after they have 'burned off excess energy'. Therefore, they will plan opportunities for physical exercise at the start of each day and more highly focused activities in the afternoon.
- Leaders understand the importance of good partnerships with parents and carers. They explain how they will liaise with parents, to ensure that they are clear about children's individual needs and how to meet them best. Leaders describe how they will operate an effective key-person system, to help children to build relationships with staff and feel secure during their time at the club.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the nominated individual, to explore leadership matters, such as staff recruitment and training. She also looked at relevant documents.
- The nominated individual explained how they organise the provision and provide enjoyable and stimulating activities for children.
- The inspector discussed with the nominated individual how they create a robust culture of safeguarding within the holiday club.
