

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 9 February 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to safety of premises, safeguarding procedures and suitable people. On 20 May 2026, the provider further notified us about matters relating to staff to child ratios. These notifications mean that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of significant events.

On 30 March 2026, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting requirements relating to special educational needs, information and record keeping, health and safety of premises. On 21 May and 15 June 2026, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting requirements relating to staff to child ratios. On 16 June 2026, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting requirements relating to suitable people.

On 23 June 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider has ensured staff training has been undertaken, as appropriate. They have held staff meetings to refresh staff knowledge around the setting's policies and procedures, including the safeguarding procedures. The provider has followed the setting's disciplinary procedures, when necessary. Additional procedures have been implemented to ensure staff to child ratios are adhered to at all times.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
