Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders understand the importance of gathering relevant information from parents before children attend. This ensures that staff can provide consistent support and tailor activities to children's individual needs and abilities.
- Leaders know to offer children a variety of activities and encourage children to contribute to these ideas. Leaders intend for children to be independent and self-motivated in making their own choices. Leaders recognise the importance of valuing children's thoughts and ideas, helping them to feel a sense of belonging.
- Leaders recognise their role in teaching children about healthy lifestyles. They ensure children have regular opportunities to be physically active, inside and outside. Leaders utilise the large space well to organise games, such as football and gymnastics.
- Leaders know how to offer a safe and welcoming environment for all children. They understand their role in keeping children safe and protecting them from risk of harm. Leaders attend regular safeguarding training. This ensures that they recognise when a child may be at risk.
- Leaders understand their role in providing consistent routines and boundaries and teaching children to value and respect others. They acknowledge the importance of setting clear expectations, to help guide children's behaviour. They ensure that children are respectful towards each other and gently remind them of rules.
- Leaders understand the importance of reflecting on the quality of what they offer, to identify areas for improvement. They attend weekly team meetings to evaluate the provision.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
