Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has failed to inform Ofsted of required changes, this is a requirement of the early years foundation stage requirements (EYFS).
- The childminder has not ensured that she has kept her first-aid certificate up to date. This is a breach of the EYFS.
- The childminder knows how to support children to have a healthy lifestyle. Through discussion, she demonstrates an understanding of the importance of providing nutritional snacks and meals, and engaging children in discussing oral health. The childminder explains how children will be physically active outdoors.
- The childminder is aware of her responsibility to complete a written summary of children's progress when they are aged between two and three years old, and to share these with parents.
- The childminder shows an understanding of how she will manage children's behaviour. She recognises the need to teach children to be independent and to help them to develop their confidence and self-esteem. The childminder explains how she will help children to develop relationships and to be kind and respectful to others, and value each other's differences.
- Through discussion, the childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals. She understands the value of sharing information to support a consistent approach to children's care and learning.
- The childminder describes how she will speak to parents about the importance of online safety and the risks involved, to keep children safe from harm.
- The childminder shows she has a good understanding about how she will support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. She understands the importance of working with parents and other professionals to ensure children's needs are met.
- The childminder talks about trips in the local community she will make with children and the importance of these. She discusses the opportunities the children will have to visit local parks and an art gallery to help teach them about the world around them.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
