Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains she will use information collected from her observations and assessments of children's learning to design her curriculum. There are age-appropriate toys and resources that she will make available to children.
- The childminder completes mandatory training, such as safeguarding, to keep her knowledge up to date. She knows how to assess the risks in her setting to make sure that it is a suitable environment for children. For example, the childminder explains she will check for broken toys and small items to avoid accidents to children.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working with parents and carers and other professionals to support children's learning. She aims to establish expectations for children's behaviour with parents for consistency. For instance, the childminder plans to discuss how parents manage their children's behaviour at home.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting children's health. For instance, she aims to practise good hygiene routines to prevent the spread of infectious illnesses. She explains how she will provide children with a variety of balanced and nutritious meals to encourage healthy eating habits. Additionally, the childminder wants children to have regular access to the outdoors to support their physical development and growth.
- The childminder aims to involve parents in her self-evaluation process. She is committed to her ongoing professional development.
- The childminder understands her duty to notify Ofsted of anything that may affect her suitability. This includes changes to her health and personal circumstances.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
