Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to observe and assess children's learning. She describes how she will monitor children's progress and plan for their next steps in learning and development.
- The childminder recognises that children are individuals. She articulates how she will adapt activities so each child can be included. The childminder is able to discuss how she intends to provide a service that is inclusive and meet the needs of all children.
- The childminder explains how she will provide an ambitious curriculum for children. She describes a range of activities and experiences that will help children develop new knowledge and skills. She has intentions for learning which aim to get children ready for their next stage of learning.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure knowledge of how to understand and respond to children's behaviour. She talks about helping children to understand rules and reinforcing the things they are doing well.
- The childminder understands how to work with parents. She explains a range of different methods she will use to share information about children's time in her care. The childminder describes how she will gather information about children's home experiences.
- The childminder has undertaken regular training and professional development. She understands how this will help her to reflect upon and improve her practice. The childminder explains how she will gather feedback from parents to help her understand her strengths and weaknesses.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
