Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The management team are passionate about providing an inclusive and welcoming environment for children. They know how to provide a range of activities and experiences for children to support their learning, development, enjoyment, and interests. The management team plan to enrich children's experiences of learning with opportunities to explore drama, dance, music, and craft activities.
- Managers successfully demonstrate how they will organise resources to help children easily access and select toys of their choice to support children to make choices for themselves.
- Managers demonstrate how they will support children's communication and language development. For example, they describe how drama activities will provide children with time to share their own thoughts and feelings with their friends and other adults at the club.
- Managers explain how they will use a calm and kind approach to managing children's behaviour and adapt their behaviour methods to suit the age and needs of each child. They talk about how they will establish rules and expectations, so children understand what is acceptable and reinforce positive and thoughtful behaviour. They talk knowledgeably about adapting routines to meet individual children's needs and supporting children to learn about how to be kind and considerate towards their friends and adults at the club.
- The management team demonstrate a good understanding of the importance of teaching children about healthy lifestyles. For example, they explain how they will ensure that children have regular opportunities to access fresh air and exercise, such as through playing ball games on the host school playground. They discuss the importance of healthy eating and encouraging children to have nutritious snacks and drink water throughout the day to remain hydrated.
- The management team are able to discuss how they will share information with parents about their children's time at the club. They explain how they intend to share information about the activities children have enjoyed to keep them updated.
- Managers explain how all staff will regularly update their safeguarding knowledge by attending regular training. They understand how to recognise and report any concerns about a child in their care. Managers have a thorough and rigorous risk assessment process to ensure all areas children will access are safe and secure.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
