Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The manager discusses the importance of safeguarding. He explains how he ensures that everyone understands how to respond to, and report, any concerns they may have about the welfare of a child. The manager emphasises how children always remain within their sight and hearing so that staff can supervise them effectively at all times.
- The manager emphasises how he creates an inclusive environment. He describes how the setting supports children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. The manager explains how children's opinions and ideas play a big part in what happens at the club. For example, staff encourage children to take turns in choosing which music and movement games they would like to do.
- The manager has a good understanding of how he intends to support children to manage their own behaviour. He helps children to learn about the different ways that they can regulate their own feelings. The manager discusses how he helps children learn about mutual respect and kindness.
- The manager creates a welcoming environment, with age-appropriate resources to help children to feel safe, reassured and settled. He explains how the routine is deeply embedded, so that children know exactly what will be happening throughout the afternoon.
- The manager gathers detailed information from parents when children first start. He works closely with the school to make sure that the individual needs of all children are met. The manager has developed strong links with other professionals, to keep his knowledge up to date.
- The manager understands how to promote children's physical well-being. He discusses how staff provide children with daily opportunities to enjoy exercise. The manager explains that being active is a large part of the setting's ethos.
- The manager follows effective procedures when recruiting and vetting staff to ensure that they are suitable to work with children. He demonstrates a strong understanding of his role and responsibilities in making sure that all staff are suitable.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
