Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of child development. She has procedures in place to observe children and assess their progress. The childminder intends to offer children a programme of play linked to their individual interests and needs.
- The childminder describes how she plans to offer a broad curriculum, including a variety of activities in the home coupled with trips within the local community. She describes how children will remain continually occupied and busy to promote their learning.
- The childminder recognises the value of working in partnership with parents. She plans to communicate with parents continually to enable her to offer complementary care for children.
- The childminder demonstrates she understands the importance of being polite when talking to children. She explains her intention to be a positive role model by treating children with respect and courtesy, fostering their emotional well-being. With a clear vision for her provision, she aims to create a welcoming, home-from-home environment where children feel secure and valued. The childminder outlines her approach to setting clear behaviour expectations, offering regular praise to help build children's confidence and self-esteem.
- The childminder plans to provide a range of nutritious, home-cooked meals to support children's health and well-being. She recognises the importance of fostering positive attitudes towards healthy eating from an early age. In addition to promoting healthy eating, she encourages physical activity and outdoor play, ensuring children have ample opportunities to get fresh air and exercise, which further contributes to their overall health.
- The childminder is aware of updating her knowledge and dedicated to her professional development, ensuring she completes a variety of training courses. She is reflective in her approach and maintains a positive attitude towards continuous improvement, always seeking ways to enhance her practice and positively impact the children in her care.
- Safety is given high priority within the setting. The childminder has implemented simple but effective measures in her home to minimise potential hazards. She is aware of her safeguarding responsibilities and understands the importance of protecting children from harm. The childminder is knowledgeable about the signs of abuse and knows exactly whom to contact should she have any concerns regarding a child's welfare.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with the childminder about how she plans to implement the educational programmes for children, as well as how she will carry out observation, assessment, and planning.
- The inspector reviewed the policies and procedures with the childminder and examined the documentation she uses when caring for children.
- The inspector conducted a tour of the areas of the premises used by the children and discussed the available equipment and toys.
- The inspector discussed safeguarding procedures with the childminder and considered the suitability checks in place.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
