Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to meet children's individual needs and interests. She is aware of the seven areas of learning and the importance of providing a range of activities and experiences to support these. This includes regular access to outdoor play and giving children opportunities to choose their own experiences.
- The childminder recognises how to support children's behaviour and the importance of helping them to build good relationships with others. She comprehends the importance of teaching children about fundamental British values and how it is important to be considerate and respectful of others.
- The childminder has good procedures in place to maintain children's health, safety and welfare. She has appropriate risk assessments in place and records for recording accidents, incidents and medication. The childminder is mindful of the important role in providing children with healthy meals, snacks and daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise to support their healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals involved in children's care and education. She has suitable procedures in place to ensure communication is open and supportive to promote continuity of care. Furthermore, appropriate complaint procedures are in place and understood.
- The childminder understands the safeguarding and welfare requirements and keeps up to date with current legislation. She is confident in the signs and indicators of potential abuse and knows the procedures to follow if she has any child protection concerns.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
