Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The management team is passionate about sports and exercise. Staff understand the importance of providing regular sporting activities that support children's physical development, teamwork and social skills. For example, staff aim for children to have lots of fun and practise skills in a range of ball games. Through discussions, leaders demonstrate their good understanding of how to support early years children. Detailed information is collected from parents to enable staff to get to know younger children well, and support their development.
- Leaders and staff demonstrate a strong understanding of the camp's policies to create a safe, inclusive and well-organised environment. Staff recognise the importance of having a well-managed provision to promote children's welfare. For instance, staff know through effective communication and teamwork, they can respond promptly to children's needs.
- Staff have clear rules and boundaries in place, and plan to share these with children to ensure they have a good understanding of the behavioural expectations. For example, staff explain how they will teach children about the importance of developing respect and kindness. This will help build their emotional resilience and social interactions.
- Staff state that they are very happy in their roles and work well as a team. Staff speak positively of the senior leaders of the camp. They comment on the high levels of support they receive for both their professional development and their well-being. Staff return to the camp each holiday, demonstrating their enjoyment.
- Parents leave positive feedback and reviews about the provider. The provider and staff recognise the importance of maintaining regular communication with parents to ensure continuity in children's care between home and camp. Leaders plan to seek feedback from parents to enable them to evaluate and develop the provision, so that children enjoy their time at the camp as much as possible.
- Leaders recognise the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles. For example, they discuss how they will support parents to provide a nutritious lunch box for their children. Leaders understand the importance of children washing their hands. They explain how they will teach children to wash their hands before mealtimes and after they have been to the toilet.
- Leaders understand the importance of implementing robust procedures to support children with allergies and medical conditions. They will ensure that children's allergies are well known and understood by staff.
- Leaders explain how their robust safer recruitment procedures and checks on all staff are carried out to ensure they are suitable to work with children. They plan to provide in-depth training and inductions for new staff, to ensure they are confident and competent in their new roles. Regular supervision will be offered to provide staff with opportunities to reflect on their practice, identify strengths, weaknesses, and training needs.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
