

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 30 September 2025, the provider notified us about matters relating to health; safeguarding policies and procedures; suitable people; qualifications, training, support and skills; safety and suitability of premises, environment and equipment and information and record keeping. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of any significant event which is likely to affect the suitability of the early years provider to look after children.

On 1 October 2025, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider has taken action to review the safe management of food in the setting. This has included further training for staff and further risk assessments to help ensure children's individual dietary needs are consistently met.

On 8 October 2025, the provider notified us that they had taken action to make a referral to the local designated safeguarding officer. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework to notify Ofsted of any significant event which is likely to affect the suitability of any person who cares for/is in regular contact with children on the premises.

On 3 December 2025, the provider shared outcomes of their internal investigations. These demonstrate that the provider has taken appropriate action to follow their own policies and procedures in relation to suitable staff. The provider has reviewed their safeguarding procedures; they have provided further training for staff. This has helped to ensure that all staff understand their roles and responsibilities to report any concerns to the local authority designated safeguarding officer in a timely way.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
