Information about this children's home

The home is owned and managed by a private provider. It provides care for up to 3 children who may experience social and emotional difficulties, and children with learning disabilities. One child was living in the home at the time of this inspection.

There has been no registered manager at the home since 16 October 2025.

This monitoring visit

On 28 January 2026, a monitoring visit was undertaken to address specific concerns or allegations received by Ofsted. Following the visit, Ofsted issued 2 compliance notices in relation to the shortfalls found. This monitoring visit was to review the action taken to meet the steps within these 2 compliance notices.

At the last visit, the child had moved out temporarily and did not return to the home. Another child moved in 3 weeks before this inspection. Neither child have made any allegations since the last inspection.

There has been one investigation into a medication error. This appears thorough, with appropriate action taken to ensure that the child is safe. The provider appropriately notified the regulator and placing authority and sought medical attention for the child.

The child who currently lives in the home has been held by staff 3 times. The staff's recording of this is detailed and provides a clear description of what led to the hold as well as how staff held the child. All instances of physical intervention were proportionate and required to keep the child and staff safe.

All records of physical intervention include reflective oversight from managers. This ensures that managers are aware of staff practice. However, for one of these

incidents none of the staff involved have taken part in a debrief conversation. One member of staff has been on holiday, which has delayed the debrief. However, the other debrief was missed. Neither the manager nor the responsible individual noticed this when they had oversight of the incident. This requirement has therefore been restated.

There has been a noticeable improvement to the environment. These changes are child focused and include moving the child's bedroom to a more suitable room for the child's needs. There has also been appropriate redecoration to minimise damage while allowing the child's sensory needs to be explored.

Leaders shared changes that have been made to safeguarding processes, particularly for when children express unhappiness at any element of their care. As there have not been any allegations from children, these remain untested and will be restated as a requirement under Regulation 12.
