

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 17 and 18 June 2025, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 26 June 2025. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out.

Actions needed by 2 July 2025:

- improve supervision arrangements to ensure that areas for development of staff are quickly addressed to have a positive impact on children's learning
- improve the relationship of the key person to ensure children's individual development and learning needs are met
- ensure staffing arrangements meet the individual learning and care needs of children
- ensure that all staff manage children's behaviour in an appropriate consistent way

- ensure strategies recommended by professionals are known and implemented by all staff working with children.

On 7 July 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions, raised at their last inspection. We found that the provider had improved the system for supervision of staff and has put in plans to address weaknesses at the setting. Leaders have improved the key person approach to support children's individual learning. Also, leaders have revised staffing arrangements to support children's individual development. Staff have attended training on managing children's behaviour positively. This has supported staff to manage children's behaviour consistently. Leaders have shared strategies recommended by professionals with key staff so they can be implemented regularly to support children. These measures help support children's individual needs and development and promotes their safety at the setting. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
