Information about this children's home

The home registered with Ofsted in February 2025 and is privately owned. It can provide care for one child who may experience social and emotional difficulties.

The registered manager left their post in July 2025. An interim manager has been appointed and is applying to register with Ofsted.

At the time of this visit, one child was living at the home. The child spoke with the inspector.

This monitoring visit

An assurance inspection on 22 July 2025 identified serious and widespread concerns. Compliance notices were issued under regulations 12,13 and 14. A subsequent monitoring visit on 9 September 2025 found improvements in the care provided to children. Two of the three compliance notices issued following the previous inspection were judged as met. However, weaknesses in responding to a child's allegation led to the compliance notice under regulation 12 being reissued.

The purpose of this visit was to evaluate the provider's progress in meeting the compliance notice issued under regulation 12.

Since the last visit, the child living in the home is safer. The number of safeguarding incidents has reduced significantly. There have been two incidents since the last monitoring visit. Staff responded appropriately in both cases to protect the child, and the manager took steps to reduce the risk of similar incidents reoccurring.

The child has made no further allegations. However, the response to the previous allegation has been reviewed by managers. The child has been spoken to, and staff were interviewed individually. The response was notably improved. Nonetheless,

errors in the recording of dates were identified during the visit. These were addressed at the time of the inspection.

The compliance notice under regulation 12 is met.
