Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders and staff provide an inclusive play environment for children. They understand how to provide activities that interest children and meet their needs. They have a clear understanding of the requirements of the early years foundation stage. Early years children will have opportunities to use a wide range of resources, including arts and craft materials. Outdoors, they will be able to enjoy planned physical sessions and join in with individual activities or team games that support children's skills.
- Through discussion, leaders explain how they safeguard children. They are familiar with the procedures to follow if they have a concern that a child may be at risk of harm. Leaders explain how they ensure that staff complete regular training. This contributes to protecting children's welfare.
- Staff demonstrate a clear understanding of how to safeguard children. They know the possible signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect and how to refer any concerns to the relevant authorities. Daily checks and risk assessments of the premises help staff to identify and to remove any potential hazards to children.
- Staff understand the importance of encouraging children to adopt a healthy lifestyle through healthy eating, being physically active and spending time outdoors.
- Staff explain how they build secure and trusting relationships with children to promote their emotional well-being and self-esteem. Leaders explained how they are mindful of how to support children's good behaviour and how they help children to be kind and respectful towards each other. They discussed how routines and activities are established, so that children know expectations and feel safe.
- Leaders recognise the value of having effective partnerships with parents and maintaining communication, which helps them to know and understand children's backgrounds and individual needs.
- Through discussion, leaders discussed how they evaluate the service provided and the importance of incorporating the views of children, parents and staff, to implement new ideas, or any changes needed.
- The documentation used by staff is sufficient to meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage. There is a secure recruitment and induction procedure in place. Leaders understand the importance of offering staff ongoing training opportunities to enhance and support their professional development.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke to children and parents during the inspection and took account of their views.
- The inspector had a discussion with leaders about the evaluation of the setting and plans for improvement.
