Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider has a clear understanding of their role in keeping children safe. They ensure all staff complete regular training to help them identify when a child may be at risk of harm. They are knowledgeable about the signs of abuse and understand the procedures to follow.
- The provider demonstrates a strong understanding of the importance of offering a wide range of age-appropriate resources to keep children engaged and interested.
- The provider recognises their role in teaching children to respect and value others. They understand the importance of setting clear and consistent boundaries to help guide children's behaviour.
- The provider is clear about their roles and responsibilities in teaching children the importance of leading healthy lifestyles. For example, they promote healthy food choices, encourage robust hygiene practises and support physical activity.
- The provider acknowledges the importance of building strong relationships with parents and values the sharing of two-way information about the activities provided.
- The provider is aware of their responsibilities to ensure that all adults working with children are suitable. They discuss how thorough checks will be completed on all staff before they begin working with children.
- The provider recognises the importance of evaluating practice. They discuss the benefits of seeking feedback from staff, parents and other professionals to help identify areas for improvement.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
