

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 7 April 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to safeguarding and food and drink. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant incident.

On 28 April 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider had reviewed and amended their food safety processes. They carried out additional training with all of the staff to ensure they were aware of the internal process to ensure that children's dietary needs are appropriately met and children safeguarded. However, during the visit we found that some staff are still not embedding this training and knowledge in their daily practice. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take.

Actions needed by 26 May 2026:

- Implement robust and regular coaching and monitoring of staff knowledge and practice to ensure they are secure in their understanding of procedures and continually embedding and demonstrating best practice.

On 20 May 2026, we carried out an unannounced regulatory visit following on from receiving the provider's action plan. We found that the provider had put in place a range of meetings, training, coaching sessions and mentoring to monitor staff knowledge and

practice. They use these sessions and their new monitoring records to ensure staff are secure in their understanding of procedures and that training is being continually embedded to secure best practice. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
