Information about this inspection

At this inspection, the inspector evaluated:

- the care of children
- the safety of children
- the effectiveness of leaders and managers.

The inspector has looked closely at the experiences and progress of children, using the social care common inspection framework. This assurance inspection was carried out under the Care Standards Act 2000 to assess the effectiveness of the service, how it meets the core functions of the service as set out in legislation, and to consider how well it complies with The Children's Homes (England) Regulations 2015 and the 'Guide to the Children's Homes Regulations, including the quality standards'.



Findings from the inspection

We did not identify any serious or widespread concerns in relation to the care or protection of children at this assurance inspection.

A new child has been welcomed into the home. Staff have supported the child to settle in their new home and quickly feel a sense of belonging. Staff have helped the child to make progress from their starting points, which includes them enjoying carrying out voluntary work at a local animal rescue farm, which is aligned with their future career aspirations.

The child said that they liked living in their home, that they have developed good relationships with staff, that they are able to go to staff if they have any worries and that the staff help allay their fears. They also said that they feel safe living in their home.

The new manager has a strong presence in the home and has quickly made vast improvements to positively change the care and support provided to the child. Their managerial oversight of the home is robust, and they have been instrumental in advocating for the child and challenging the virtual school in order to secure the right educational provision to meet the child's needs and help them succeed.

Staff know the child's vulnerabilities and what they need to do to keep them safe and protected from harm. The child is being supported by staff to understand how to keep themselves safe, for example when going online. The child has not been involved in any safeguarding incidents and has not gone missing from home, and staff have not had to use physical interventions.

The staff understand the importance of having a structured routine in place for the child and the significant positive impact this has on the child's daily life. The manager and staff realise that structure provides a sense of security to the child, reduces anxiety and stress and enhances their emotional well-being. Staff are also supporting the child to have a healthy, balanced diet and ensuring they attend all their healthcare appointments.

The requirements made at the last inspection have all been met, and there have been no new requirements or recommendations made following the inspection.
