Inspected under the social care common inspection framework

Information about this children's home

This privately run children's home provides care for up to three children who may have social and emotional difficulties.

At the time of the inspection, one child was living in the home.

The home and the manager were registered with Ofsted in February 2025. There is no registered manager in post.

This monitoring visit

This home was judged as inadequate at the full inspection on 8 July 2025. There have been no children move in or out of the home since the inspection.

Since the inspection, the manager has left. The responsible individual is overseeing the day-to-day care alongside the deputy manager. A new manager has been appointed but is yet to start in post.

The child currently living in the home is well protected. Staff understand the child's risks and follow clear plans to keep the child safe, including regular conversations about staying safe online. When concerns arise about the child being contacted outside of agreed channels, staff act quickly and follow safeguarding procedures, which helps to maintain a safe and trusting environment for the child.

The child has settled into the home since moving in and has built positive relationships with staff. This helps the child to feel safe and secure. Staff respond calmly to the child's needs and support them to talk about their feelings, including sensitive issues, while giving the child space when needed.

The child enjoys a range of activities in line with their interests, including holidays away, visits to water parks, golf outings and other summer activities, all of which are well organised by staff. The child says they are happy in the home.

Staff communicate well with the child's school to support their progress. Staff understand the importance of children's relationships and actively support family time, managing it creatively to meet individual needs. Staff respond sensitively to emerging difficulties for the child, including changes in family relationships, working closely with the child's social worker and therapeutic team to provide appropriate support and guidance.

Leaders and managers have ensured that staff have received additional training, including therapeutic support, and they provide staff with regular opportunities to reflect on their practice. This ongoing development, guided by managers, psychologists and social workers, helps improve staff skills and supports better outcomes for the child's experience, ensuring they feel secure and understood.

One social worker commented that staff have been 'brilliant at adapting to what the child needs and making sure they feel listened to', highlighting the positive impact of the staff's flexible and responsive approach.

Leaders and managers have clear oversight of all incidents and have introduced new systems to monitor and review the quality of care. Managers have implemented clear documents that help staff track the child's progress and well-being. This gives managers a good understanding of how the child is doing and ensures the support provided is effective. As a result, the child feels cared for and is better able to manage their emotions, which helps them settle and build positive relationships.

Some requirements made at the previous inspection have been met, while others were not considered during this visit but will be reviewed at the next full inspection.
