Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to plan activities for children to help extend their learning. She explains how she plans to work with parents from the start to gather information to inform her observations and assessments and to keep them well informed.
- The childminder accesses regular safeguarding training and ensures her knowledge is fully up to date. She is alert to the potential signs that a child's safety or welfare may be at risk and understands how to report concerns in line with local procedures.
- The childminder has high expectations. She describes how she intends to evaluate her provision to help her to identify improvements and drive forward the quality.
- The childminder is aware of the range of professionals available to work with if she requires additional support for children. She explains how she intends to liaise with other settings that children attend to provide consistency in care and learning.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how to promote children's understanding of other cultures and beliefs. She describes how she intends to provide an inclusive setting where each child is welcomed and valued as an individual.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to develop the educational programmes, including observing and assessing children's development.
- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the childminder's home intended for childminding purposes.
- The inspector viewed a range of documents, including a sample of policies and procedures and checked evidence of the suitability of adults living on the premises.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder regarding how she intends to meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage.

The childminder registered in 1992 and lives in the Timperley area of Altrincham, Cheshire. She operates all year round from 7.30am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays.
