Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a suitable range of easily accessible resources to interest and engage children.
- The childminder explains how she will ensure that her resources and activities will be age appropriate and challenging to enable children to make progress.
- The childminder describes how she will promote children's health by providing healthy, home-cooked meals, easy access to drinks and daily access to fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder demonstrates clear knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The childminder shows an understanding of how to keep children safe; she has a current first-aid certificate and has attended safeguarding training.
- The childminder appropriately demonstrates how she reduces hazards to children and protects them. For example, she completes written risk assessments for her home and outings.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents to support children's care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed all areas of the house used for childminding purposes.
- The inspector looked at a range of documentation, including the childminder's policies and procedures and qualification and insurance documentation.
- The inspector held a discussion with the childminder about how she intends to meet the learning and development and safeguarding requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
