Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to promote healthy lifestyles. She plans to provide children with healthy snacks and promote their physical development through a range of activities outside the home.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how to deliver an educational programme that meets the requirements of the early years foundation stage. She knows how to assess children's progress and plan for their future learning.
- The childminder knows how to make her home into a safe, secure and welcoming environment where children have access to a wide range of resources and learning opportunities.
- The childminder demonstrates a good knowledge of safeguarding issues and has attended training to ensure her knowledge is up to date.
- The childminder understands the importance of reflecting on her practice. She undertakes continuous professional development to improve her knowledge and skills. She discusses how she would regularly gather the views of parents and children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she has updated her skills and knowledge and evaluated her practice.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.

The childminder registered in 1999 and lives in the Swillington area of Leeds, West Yorkshire. She operates all year round from 7am to 9am and from 3.30pm to 5.30pm, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays. The childminder holds an appropriate childcare qualification at level 3.
