

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 2 June 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to concerns about children's safety and welfare, safeguarding policies and procedures, supervision of staff, staff: child ratios, information for parents and carers, changes that must be notified to Ofsted. The provider notified us that a child had been inadvertently left in a bathroom area and play room for approximately three and a half minutes. The child did not come to any harm. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 2 July 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting one of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. Staff now communicate with each other regularly to discuss how many children they have in their care, rather than recording this information. They have also received training to understand the importance of knowing the location of all children even if they are not working directly with them in a room. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

On 25 June 2026, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting requirements relating to staff: child ratios, paediatric first aid, accident or injury, risk assessment. On 2 July 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting one of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider has ensured that staff understand the importance of risk assessing in the moment to help prevent accidents to children.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the

enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
