Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of using observations of children's learning to plan for what they need to learn next. Through discussion, the childminder explains how she will provide activities that are tailored to children's individual interests, helping to keep them engaged and motivated. She recognises the value of supporting children to make consistent progress across all areas of learning and development. The childminder explains how she will ensure that each child receives the guidance they need to thrive.
- The childminder acknowledges the importance of promoting positive behaviour in young children and setting clear and consistent expectations. She discusses how she will support children to become more independent and prepare them for the transition on to school. The childminder places a strong emphasis on children's social development. For example, she describes how she will encourage children to listen, share and take turns while they play.
- The childminder understands the importance of encouraging children's healthy lifestyles from an early age. Through discussion, she explains how she will provide nutritious snacks and ensure that children have regular opportunities to be physically active outdoors and enjoy fresh air. The childminder recognises that promoting healthy habits contributes to children's physical development and overall well-being.
- The childminder recognises the importance of creating an inclusive and welcoming environment, where children are encouraged to respect and value each other's differences. She describes how she will use a wide range of age-appropriate resources that reflect diversity and support inclusive practice. The childminder explains she will ensure that all children feel represented and included in their learning environment.
- The childminder understands the importance of working closely with parents and carers and other professionals to ensure continuity of care and learning for children. She values the role of partnership in supporting each child's development and adapting her approach, based on shared expertise.
- The childminder is committed to improving the quality of her setting and recognises the importance of ongoing professional development. She explains that she will regularly reflect on her practice and use self-evaluation to identify areas for improvement, with the aim of having a positive impact on the progress children make.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
