Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to observe, assess and monitor children's achievements to help them make progress in their learning. She continues to develop knowledge of up-to-date practice. She attends regular training and evaluates her provision.
- The childminder knows how to identify if children are at risk of harm and the reporting procedures to follow. She has an effective policy and reporting procedure in place.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of working in partnership with parents and others to help meet children's individual needs and ensure continuity of care.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing an inclusive, welcoming and friendly environment which ensures children's ongoing safety and well-being.
- The childminder understands how to promote a healthy lifestyle for children. She encourages a healthy diet and all meals and snacks are healthy and home cooked. She understands the importance of providing children with regular access to the outdoors.
- The childminder knows how to promote positive behaviour and understands the importance of helping children to be kind and tolerant of each other's diverse needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector had a tour of the premises used by the children and discussed the equipment and resources available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.
