Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has attended a refresher safeguarding course to help keep her knowledge and understanding up to date. She knows the procedures to follow should she have a child protection concern, which promotes children's welfare.
- The childminder has addressed the previous action and recommendations. She has a sound knowledge and understanding of undertaking observation and assessments, to promote children's learning and development.
- The childminder has a sound understanding of the importance of developing partnerships with parents, and of encouraging parents to contribute to children's ongoing assessments. This supports continuity of care and learning.
- The childminder has an appropriate understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage, and the type of activities to provide to promote children's progress in all areas of learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing an inclusive environment. She knows to obtain useful information about all children's individual needs to ensure these are met.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate the quality of her practice and provision. She understands the importance of obtaining parents' contributions to promote positive outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.
- The inspector looked at the toys, resources and space available for childminding.
- The inspector looked at available documents and discussed the childminder's policies and procedures with her.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder, how she has addressed the previous action and recommendations in relation to documentation, partnerships, the Early Years Foundation Stage, observation and assessments, and processes for self-evaluation.
