Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has addressed all actions raised at her previous inspection. She has obtained public liability insurance, carries out risk assessments of her premises, and she is fully aware of her responsibility to notify Ofsted of significant events.
- The childminder has refreshed her knowledge on child protection procedures. As a result, she knows the correct procedures to follow if she has a concern about a child's safety and well-being. The childminder also demonstrates a good understanding of action to take if an allegation is made against herself or a family member.
- The childminder recognises that children are unique and have different learning preferences, which she will record when children first start. She is aware that activities can be adapted to meet children's individual learning needs, and that good quality teaching will help children acquire the skills they need for future learning.
- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of carrying out observations and assessments of children's learning and development. She has good procedures in place to monitor the progress that children make in all areas of their learning, and how she can support their learning if gaps begin to emerge.
- The childminder has a system to complete the progress check for children aged two years. She is aware of the requirement to share the progress check with parents and if needed, outside agencies to support integrated working.
- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of how to promote children's good health and emotional well-being. She understands how to manage children's behaviour and how to ensure that all children feel included and valued.
- The childminder is realistic in her self-evaluation and she demonstrates a commitment to further improve the quality of practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
