Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to monitor children's learning and development and prepare them for their next stage of learning, including starting school. She knows how to use observations to identify their next steps in learning and plan activities.
- The childminder knows how safeguard children. She understands how to identify and report any child protection concerns to protect children's welfare, and assess and minimise potential risks in her home.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working closely with parents to help her understand and meet children's care and learning needs. She understands how to develop relationships with children to help them settle and support their well-being.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate and improve her practice. She plans to seek feedback from parents and children to gain their views.
- The childminder knows how to support children's physical well-being. For example, she plans to provide children with opportunities to play outdoors, exercise and eat healthily.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector observed all areas in the house available for minding children.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her knowledge of the early years foundation stage requirements, including safeguarding.
- The inspector viewed a sample of documentation.
