Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a clear understanding of the processes she should follow if she has concerns about a child's safety. She has carefully considered the safety of her home and how she will minimise risks when visiting new places.
- The childminder understands how she can support children in their learning and development. She demonstrates a thorough understanding of the different ways children learn and how activities can be differentiated depending on their needs.
- The childminder is eager to work closely with parents to support each child. She recognises the benefit of attending relevant training to help support her with this. The childminder plans to regularly seek the views of parents and children to help her assess what she does well and plan future improvements.
- The childminder understands the importance of ensuring her home is welcoming and secure. She has a clear awareness of how she can help new children settle in and support any transitions to school.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her understanding of the requirements.
- The inspector reviewed a sample of records and documentation, such as attendance records and various written policies.
- The inspector reviewed written references from parents of older children who the childminder currently cares for.
