Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to keep children safe from harm. She knows the relevant procedures to follow should she have a concern for a child's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to provide a range of opportunities for children to enjoy. She understands how children learn and how to help them make progress in their learning.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of supporting children's health and well-being. For example, she is aware of providing opportunities for children to be active outdoors during the day.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour and support them to be kind and have respect for each other.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of working with parents and other professionals to support continuity in children's care and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of keeping children safe. For example, she knows to check her home for any hazards and when outdoors.
- The childminder attends training events to keep up to date with changes to support her professional development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in 2002. She lives in the London Borough of Enfield. The childminder works with her husband who is a registered assistant. The childminder is available from 7.30am to 7pm, Monday to Friday, all year round, except for bank holidays or family holidays. At the time of the inspection the childminder had no children on roll.
