Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to promote and celebrate diversity, including how to help children learn to respect one another and the wider community.
- The childminder is insightful. She evaluates what is working well and how best to improve outcomes for children, taking the views of parents and children into account.
- The childminder understands the importance of keeping her knowledge up to date. She works closely with her local authority to help maintain and improve her practice.
- The childminder knows how to work in close partnership with parents and other early years settings to improve outcomes for children.
- The childminder knows how to safeguard children, including the action to take if she has any welfare concerns.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
