Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has high expectations for children and explains she will plan a curriculum that meets the needs of all children and focuses on exploring their unique interests and developing their skills.
- The childminder discusses she will place a strong focus on providing an inclusive setting. She aims to teach children about differences and similarities. She discusses she will focus her teaching on accepting everybody for who they are and respecting each other.
- The childminder explains she will support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. She will adapt her practice to ensure that she meets the needs of all children.
- The childminder understands the importance of positive relationships and explains she will strive to ensure that she builds strong bonds with children. She speaks about the importance of parent partnership. She will work closely with parents to ensure that children feel secure within the setting.
- The childminder has high expectations for children's behaviour. She explains she has developed rules for the setting which will help children to build their understanding of boundaries.
- The childminder is reflective, she will review and evaluate the setting to ensure that she continuously develops her practice. She understands that she will keep her knowledge up to date by attending regular training. She discusses she researches into topics of interest to support and develop her practice.
- The childminder has an understanding of safeguarding and child protection procedures. She knows the steps to take if she has concerns about a child's safety. The childminder completes risk assessments on the premises to ensure that the setting is safe for children.
- The childminder explains she will teach children about healthy lifestyles to help them gain an understanding of healthy practices.
- The childminder is aware of how to manage food allergies and will teach children about the importance of this during mealtimes. This will support children to stay safe, especially during mealtimes.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with the childminder about the leadership and management of the setting.
- The childminder spoke to the inspector about how they support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities.
- The childminder provided the inspector with a sample of key documentation on request.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
