Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to promote children's learning and development. She knows how to provide activities that follow children's interests and meet the needs of children with differing ages, abilities and backgrounds.
- The childminder understands how to safeguard children. She has policies that meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage, and follow the Local Safeguarding Children Board guidance.
- The childminder understands the need to maintain children's good health. She teaches children about healthy lifestyles by providing outdoor play experiences, physical exercise, and by ensuring parents provide nutritious balanced meals.
- The childminder understands the importance of partnership working with parents. She shares information with parents on children's progress and their activities.
- The childminder evaluates and develop her practice by taking into account the views of parents, children and other professionals. This is to help her set challenging targets for the future, and identify training needs to promote children's learning and development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector looked at evidence of the suitability of household members, and sampled a range of other documentation, including the safeguarding procedure.
- The inspector and childminder looked at the areas of the house and garden where childcare will be provided.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of her safeguarding and welfare requirements, and the systems she has in place to keep children safe.
