Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has systems in place to observe, assess and monitor children's progress, and she understands the importance of supporting children to achieve.
- Partnerships with parents are strong, which helps to ensure that the childminder provides children with consistency in their care and meets their needs.
- The childminder implements effective procedures to promote children's safety, health and well-being. She reinforces safety messages effectively with children, such as by practising the emergency evacuation with them.
- The childminder has an understanding of child protection issues. She understands her responsibility to report any concerns about children's welfare, and keep appropriate records.
- The childminder knows the importance of continually improving her provision for children. She recently attended training to ensure that she keeps her knowledge up to date to enhance children's overall learning experiences.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed all areas that are used for childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to support children's learning and care.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder the policies, procedures and documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of all household members, and checked training records completed by the childminder.
