Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of continuing to develop her skills and knowledge as a childminder. She describes how she provides children with nutritious meals and regular opportunities to enjoy fresh air and exercise. She knows how to respond to any accidents and emergencies that may arise. However, she has not renewed her paediatric first-aid training in the required timeframe.
- The childminder explains how she will provide a broad curriculum that considers children's ages and stages of development. She intends to provide activities that are tailored to children's individual learning needs and interests.
- The childminder demonstrates that she creates an inclusive environment for children. She understands how to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. She discusses how she would make sure every child could access her provision and enjoy the experiences she offers.
- The childminder has high expectations regarding children's behaviour. She knows how to manage children's behaviour in a supportive way and how to build sharing, turn taking and an understanding of others into daily activities.
- The childminder carries out regular risk assessments to identify and minimise risks indoors, outdoors and for outings, to promote children's safety. All areas of the premises, resources and equipment intended to be used for childminding are risk assessed and suitable for their purpose.
- The childminder recognises the importance of having strong partnerships with parents, other professionals, and staff at settings children attend. She explains how she will share children's progress and help parents to support their children's development. She explains this is to ensure children's continuity of care and learning and to meet the individual needs of all children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
