The setting **does not meet legal requirements for early years settings**

Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not understand the importance of evaluating her provision to improve it. She has not kept up to date and has not undertaken any training since 2003.
- The childminder does not have knowledge or understanding of her responsibility to meet the learning and development requirements or know how to implement these effectively.
- The childminder does not have a sufficient range of toys and resources to support and challenge children in their learning to help them to make good progress from their starting points on entry.
- The childminder does not meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements. She does not hold a current paediatric first-aid certificate. This has been set as a recommendation in the past.
- The childminder does not have sufficient knowledge of child-protection matters and local safeguarding procedures to know what procedures she must follow should she have concerns for a child's welfare. The childminder does not meet the Childcare Register requirements; she does not have a written safeguarding statement.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's good health by implementing effective good hygiene measures.
- The childminder knows how to risk assess her premises so children play in safety.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage the provider must:

- gain knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements of the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage and how to implement these effectively
- attend a child-protection training course to identify, understand and respond appropriately to signs of possible abuse and neglect
- complete paediatric first-aid training relevant for workers caring for young children and babies and maintain a suitable first-aid certificate
- increase the range of resources to provide a challenging and enjoyable experience for children in all areas of learning

To meet the requirements of the Childcare Register the provider must:

- keep and implement a written statement of procedures to be followed for the protection of children, intended to safeguard the children being cared for from abuse or neglect (compulsory part of the Childcare Register)
- attend child-protection training to identify and act on any indications that a child may be suffering from harm (compulsory part of the Childcare Register).
- keep and implement a written statement of procedures to be followed for the protection of children, intended to safeguard the children being cared for from abuse or neglect (voluntary part of the Childcare Register)

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans to deliver the learning and development requirements for children.
- The inspector looked at the childminder's paperwork and viewed the areas of her home available for childminding use.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she evaluates her practice, particularly in relation to safeguarding practices.
