Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of developing an effective partnership with parents to meet the needs of the children.
- The childminder reflects and monitors her practice. She attends relevant training to help ensure her knowledge remains up to date and to continually improve the outcomes for children.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of her responsibility to keep detailed records of and to report any child protection concerns.
- The childminder keeps the relevant and appropriate first-aid training up to date. This helps her to respond appropriately to accident and emergencies.
- The childminder knows how to arrange suitable activities to support children to have fun as they learn. She has a range of toys and resources to meet the different ages and skills of the children.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's well-being and the importance of a healthy diet and lifestyle.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector sampled some of the documentation that the childminder has to support her work.
- The inspector and the childminder discussed her methods of assessing children's progress and her planning for children's development.
- The inspector and the childminder discussed the childminder's self-evaluation systems and her improvement plan.
- The childminder discussed how the childminder keeps children safe and her understanding of safeguarding.
- The inspector viewed the spaces, toys and equipment available for childminding purposes.
