Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The committee has not ensured that there is at least one person present at the club with a paediatric first-aid qualification at all times. This breaches the safeguarding and welfare requirements. However, the staff who work in the club know how to deal with medical emergencies, such as a child choking or suffering an allergic reaction.
- Staff understand their responsibilities to safeguard children. They undertake safeguarding training and recognise the signs that would cause them to be concerned about a child's welfare. They follow the club's policies and procedures, which are regularly reviewed. Staff are familiar with local safeguarding procedures, including how to respond to allegations that are made against any staff.
- Staff explain how they support children's good physical health. They remind children about the importance of handwashing at appropriate times. Children have access to an outdoor space, where they can be physically active and enjoy the health benefits of fresh air.
- Staff understand the importance of promoting an inclusive and welcoming club to support children's self-esteem and sense of belonging. They offer resources that help children learn about different communities and cultures to further their appreciation of the diversity of the world.
- Club staff explain how they maintain the safety of children while attending the club. For example, they make regular checks on resources to ensure that they are suitable for children. They ensure that children are well supervised at all times, both indoors and outdoors. Staff help children develop an understanding of how to keep themselves safe, for example, when online.
- Staff know how to plan an environment that supports children's independence and motivation. They find out what interests children, through their conversations with them, and provide resources that reflect these interests. There is always a good range of accessible resources for children.
- Staff have high expectations for children's behaviour. They have clear rules in place to promote a friendly and cooperative ethos that supports children's well-being and social skills.
- Staff work in partnership with the host school and parents. Relevant information is shared between the school and the club to provide consistency and continuity for children. Staff value the relationships they build with parents of children who attend the club.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
